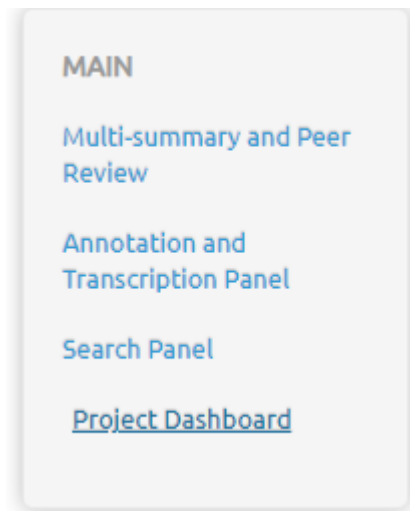

HOW TO USE THE DOWNLOAD FUNCTIONALITY IN THE OPENMWS PROJECT DASHBOARD

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Project Dashboard is the last heading on the menu that appears on the left after accessing OpenMWS as a Participant (See *OpenMWS Access* manual for details).



When clicking on *Project Dashboard* a new page appears with a table containing all the files relating to the Project in question (in the case illustrated V10 PXL/AWN 19_01_24). All the data uploaded or inserted via the transcription and annotation tools is saved in each of these files. The files under the *Download* heading on the right hand-side of the table contain different types and presentations of data ready to be downloaded, compared and further processed. The files and their names reflect the distinction between transcription and annotation data (see Annotation and Transcription Panel): unlike transcription data, annotation data is searchable within OpenMWS thanks to the descriptors recorded in *annotated* files.

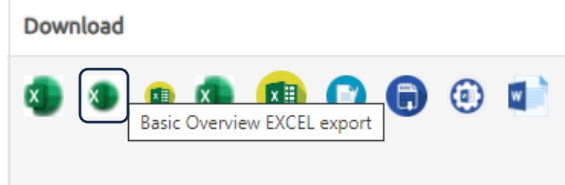

To download a file, click on one of the icons. Note that the first five relate to Excel tables, the remainder Word files. The name for each file appears when your mouse hovers over the icon.

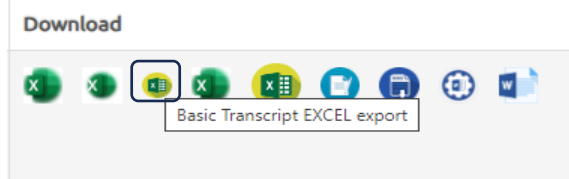
1. The first icon, *Whole EXCEL export*, downloads an Excel version of the entire project stored on the server.



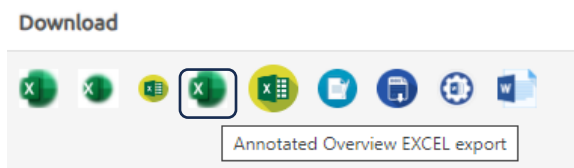
2. The second icon, *Basic Overview EXCEL export*, contains the *Overview* sheet of the project with all the data relating to the items making up the corpus such as their title, YouTube address, duration and so on.



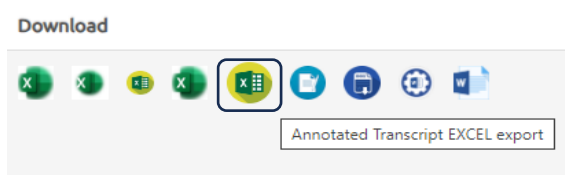
3. The third icon, *Basic Transcript EXCEL export*, contains structured transcriptions of videos: each item is numbered and divided into individual sequences containing *inter alia* a transcription of oral and written discourse and further identified by time points and time spans.



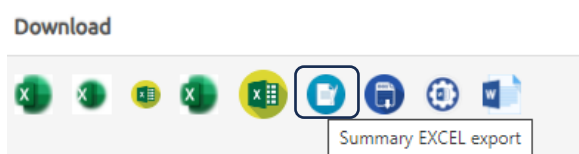
4. The fourth icon, *Annotated Overview EXCEL export*, contains the data in the *basic overview export* file plus annotations i.e. the set of metatextual descriptors used to further annotate each item.



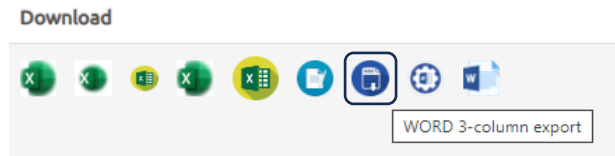
5. Like the fourth icon, the fifth icon, *Annotated Transcript EXCEL export*, contains the data in the *basic transcript export* file plus a set of metatextual descriptors used, in this case to further annotate each sequence.



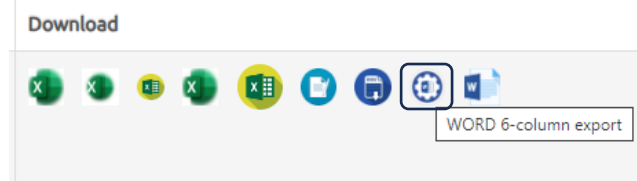
6. The sixth icon, *Summary EXCEL export*, contains the item name and summaries relating to each video. This is the Excel counterpart to the data inserted in the Multi-Summary and Peer Review section of the menu.



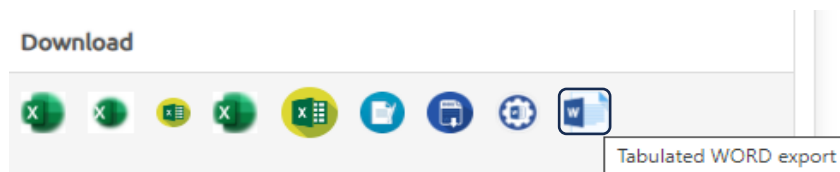
7. The seventh file, *WORD 3-column export*, is a Word file containing a three-column Word transcript of the videos divided into sequences.



8. The eighth file, *WORD 6-column export*, is another Word export but this time with a total of six columns, and hence with a larger set of transcript data.



9. The ninth file, *Tabulated WORD export*, contains a transcription for each video presented as a separate table with further space for annotations. It also contains the title and summary for each video in the top row of the table.



NB. The previous columns in each row of the Project Dashboard show data relating to the total duration of the videos in the corpus as well as the total number of words that the corpus contains: while the last column in the screenshot below indicates the overall number of words *actually* spoken, the count in the last but one column *also* takes speaker names (which have been recorded in the transcript to identify speaker turns and identities) into consideration.
